The past two weeks have been busy with school council elections and house meetings. The children who put themselves forward for this responsible job as class school councillor had really thought about the role. We were so impressed with their speeches as they spoke with maturity and a deep understanding of what it means to be a school councillor. The class voted and those votes were carefully counted. They will find out next week in assembly and although there are only two positions, they all were fantastic, and we were so proud of them all.

The children are thoroughly enjoying our text 'The Wild Robot' and they have extended their vocabulary knowledge ready to use in their own writing. Each reading session, they are enthusiastic and actively reading with us. The story is exciting, and they can predict what will happen next. We are loving reading in school and now the children have a reading book we hope they are loving reading at home too. In writing, the children have written a descriptive paragraph about their own monster which included a range of adventurous adjectives. They have learnt to edit and redraft their writing. The children were very proud of their work, and this showed in their beautiful books.

In maths, we are now working on addition and subtraction. This week, the children are adding and subtracting ones from 3-digit numbers before moving on to tens. They are using their knowledge of number bonds to efficiently calculate problems.

In science, they children have loved learning about the bones and their importance to helping us to move. They all showed off their biceps when we discovered how muscles contract and relax. We have been investigating if tall people are the fastest runners and there were some surprises.

In history, the children have learnt many facts about the Stone Age and how they lived. They can tell you the names of the 3 eras. They know the animals that were hunted and the tools they used. It has been lovely that children are finding out about the Stone Age at home and sharing with the class.

A final note, thank you for those parents who have kindly offered to help with making the vegetable tarts. The children are extremely excited for next week to arrive. Please speak with your teachers about timings for this activity.
