WHAT HAVE WE LEARNT?

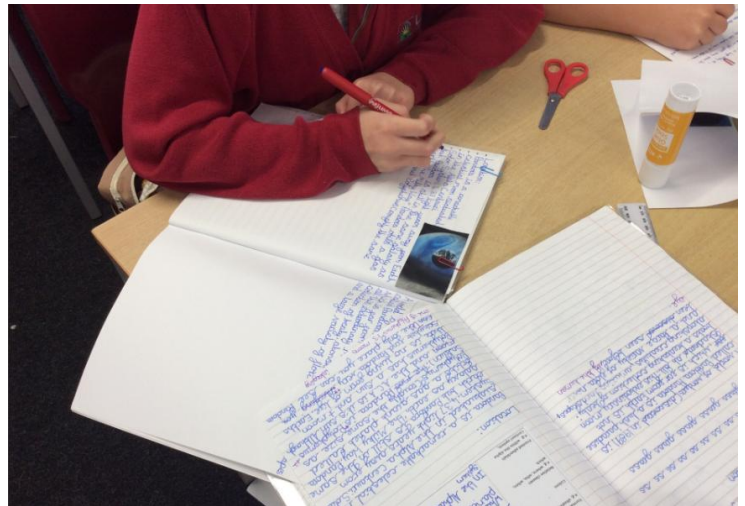
Thank you so much to everyone who came along to Parents' Evening—we hope you all found the conversations helpful and informative. It was a pleasure to share the wonderful progress the children are making.

In literacy, the children have been fully immersed in writing their reports on Pandora, and it has quickly become one of the most popular units of the term! They have been working hard to include a range of sophisticated writing features, such as relative clauses, subordinate clauses, colons (both to explain and to list), and parenthesis. They are now in the publishing stage, and we can't wait to show you the finished pieces—they are looking fantastic already!

In maths, we have been tackling fractions in depth: adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing. It has been a big topic that has required lots of times-tables knowledge, but the children have shown brilliant perseverance and are feeling much more confident with their skills. Next, we'll be moving on to finding fractions of amounts before beginning our next unit on converting units in the coming weeks.

Our geography topic this half term has been Globalization. We have explored how trade and communication happen around the world and discussed how these processes have changed over time. The children have asked thoughtful questions and shown great interest in the topic.

Science has been full of investigation and discovery as we explored classification. The children practised using dichotomous keys—answering a sequence of 'yes' or 'no' questions to identify living things—before creating their own! This hands-on approach has helped them understand how scientists organise and classify the natural world.
