## Headteacher News

Dear Loose Community,

It has been wonderful to welcome everyone back to school and to see our community thriving from the very first week. After the calm and quiet of summer, returning to school feels a little like opening the doors to a theatre just before a performance begins – the stage comes alive, the audience hums with anticipation, and the energy builds with every passing moment. That same buzz has been felt across Loose this week, and it has been inspiring to witness.

The staff have already created a real sense of excitement as they get to know their new classes, and the atmosphere across the school has been full of life. ## Naming Belongings

Can parents/carers please make sure ALL belongings are named clearly. This applies to all school uniform as well as water bottles, lunch boxes, pencil cases, PE kits, shoes etc. We had a huge amount of lost property left over at the end of the last academic year. If your child's belongings are named then they should find their way back to them if lost thank you.



## Sickness, Medicines & Medical Appointment

### ***Sickness***

If your child is sick, please either email [absence@loose-primary.kent.sch.uk](mailto:absence@loose-primary.kent.sch.uk) or telephone the school each morning on 01622 743549 between 7.30am and **no later than 8.45am** and leave full details on the absence line. If your child has **sickness or diarrhoea they must not return to school until at least 48 hours after their last episode** in line with the Kent Health Protection Unit guidelines.

### ***Medicines***

We are only able to administer 'prescribed only' medicine during school hours (not 'as and when' medicines) and this should be in its original container, with the prescriber's instructions and child's name attached where relevant. All medicines must be labelled and handed into the main school office (**please do NOT give to teachers**) along with a completed medication form.

Medicines are given at 11.45am in Years R, 1 & 2 and as necessary for Years 3 to 6 who come to the office themselves for medicines. Please arrange medication times, especially antibiotics, so that they can be administered at 11.45am in KS1 or where possible outside of school hours.

### ***Medical/Dental Appointments***

Where possible all non-urgent medical, dental and optician appointments should be made **outside of school hours** or in the school holidays. **There are 178 days a year when children are not at school for non-urgent appointments.** We understand that hospital appointments may be during the school day. Copies of all appointment letters must be emailed into the school office for our files so the absence can be recorded as authorised.



## WhatsApp Class Groups

### **A Note on Class WhatsApp Groups**

We know that class WhatsApp groups can be a really helpful way for parents to share reminders and support each other. However, we kindly ask that everyone uses these groups in a positive and considerate way. Please remember that comments made online can sometimes be misinterpreted and may cause unnecessary upset.

We would encourage all parents to:

- Keep messages respectful and supportive.
- Use the groups for practical reminders and helpful information.
- Avoid discussing individual children, staff, or school matters in the group – these should always be raised directly with school.

By keeping these spaces kind and constructive, we can ensure they remain a useful tool for everyone. Thank you for your support in helping to maintain a positive community around our school and helping uphold the school values.

## Emails into School

There are many ways to find out the information you require about your child or school related matters.

Please speak to your child's class teacher before or after school where possible with any queries you have for them. All children have a contact book so please use this for miscellaneous notes, including changes to collection arrangements at the end of the day, and remind your child to hand it to their teacher when they get into school. If your child does not have a contact book a note to the teacher would suffice.

For term dates and queries about letters that have gone home, please check the school website [www.loose-primary.kent.sch.uk](http://www.loose-primary.kent.sch.uk) first. There is a wealth of information online including terms dates for this year and next, copies of most letters that have gone home, newsletters and all sorts of other information.

If your child has lost an item of clothing, ask them to check round their classroom first and ask their teacher/TA to help via a note in their learning journal or catch a teacher at the end of the day. Parents can also come into the lower KS2 cloakroom and check lost property themselves at the end of the school day.

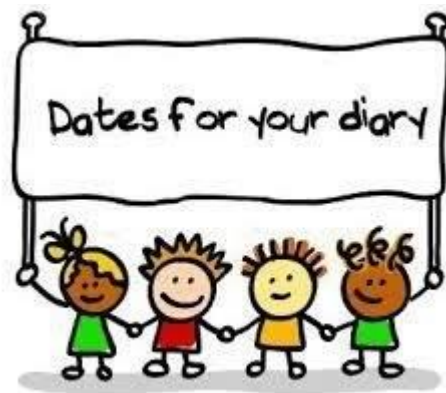
