Dear Loose School Community,

What a week it has been! As we edge ever closer to the end of term, it is wonderful to pause and reflect on all that we have celebrated together.

Our EYFS team deserve particular recognition for their relentless work. They have worked tirelessly to ensure our very youngest pupils are settled, safe, and happy in school. It's a wonder to see them learn and engage in their environment so well already. Their recent *biscuit baking* project was nothing short of marvelous – the smell, the joy, and the sense of achievement were delightful to witness. This was a shining example of Pride in their learning supporting our new pupils as they take their first steps into school life and first steps into financial literacy.

We also enjoyed a fabulous school disco, which was as popular as ever. These events simply would not happen without the commitment of key staff and the fantastic support of our PTA. Their efforts showed both Determination and Trust, ensuring our children could come together in a safe and joyful space, celebrating music and friendship together. And I have to say, it was brilliant to see not just the children, but even a few of our teachers enjoying the music and dancing the evening away!

During the disco, four incredible Year 6 pupils showed a true act of service and compassion by setting up their own stall to raise money for their friend, Harry and the charity that supports this area. - Dedicated time each week for class teachers to work directly with their pupils with SEN to ensure the very best outcomes.
- Exploring new technologies that can help our children learn in new and exciting ways, helping them to achieve with Pride and Independence. Our teaching assistants play a marvelous role in supporting all pupils, including those with SEND. At the same time, we are equally focused on building **every child's** independence as a learner, so that they leave Loose proud and determined to succeed.

Hot chocolate Friday was great today, lots of smiles, jokes and even some yodeling from the KS2 group!

Next week we will come together for our harvest festival at the church. I look forward to welcoming you all and thanking you for your donations.

Thank you, as always, for your support and partnership. Together, we make Loose a place where children feel safe, loved, and challenged to achieve their very best.

## Forest School in Year 1

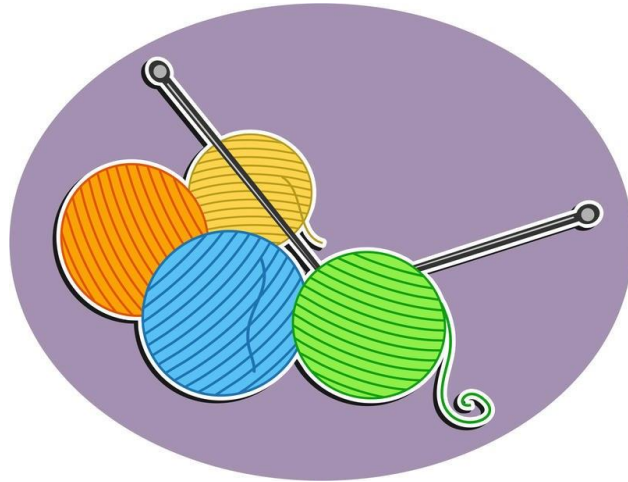

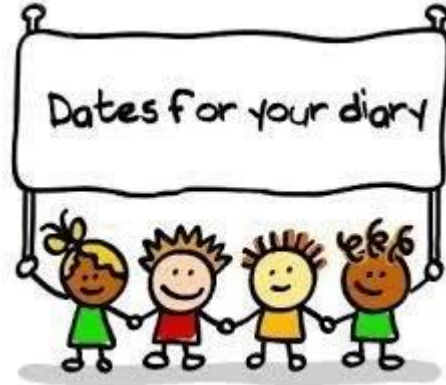

## E-Scooters - Advice from Kent Road Safety Team

Please see advice for families regarding E-Scooters.

There continues to be an increasing number of individuals riding e-scooters on the public highway, pavements and in public open spaces.

E-Scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It is not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it is illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as pavements.

We understand many parents/carers may wish to purchase an e-scooter or perhaps already have, so therefore **we urge you to disseminate the following information throughout your school community.**

### **Enforcement**

The police are obliged to take action against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances, the police have the power to seize the e-scooter under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act/165 of the Road Traffic Act.

You risk a £300 fine, six penalty points endorsed on your driving licence and the E-Scooter being seized. If you do not currently hold a driving licence at the time of the offence, you may be prosecuted and may have to go to court, whereby the fine can increase and your ability to obtain a driving licence in the future may be affected. If you purchase an E-Scooter, it can only be used on private land with the landowner's consent.

### **Fire Safety**

Kent Fire and Rescue Service always advises people to use, charge and store lithium-ion batteries safely and responsibly to help reduce the risk of a fire.

Lithium-ion batteries, or li-ion batteries (sometimes called LIBs) are found in many household items, including mobile phones, laptops, e-bikes, e-scooters, vaping devices, and vacuums.

If used or stored incorrectly, there is a risk these batteries could ignite or start a fire.

To help avoid an emergency, remember to:

- Buy electrical items from a reputable retailer
- Follow the manufacturer's guidance on charging and storing
- Only charge during the day when you are at home, and on a non-flammable surface

- Always unplug after use or when charged
- Avoid storing, using or charging batteries at very high or low temperatures
- Protect batteries from being damaged, such as being crushed, punctured, or immersed in water. If a battery has been damaged, don't use it.

The Government is currently trialing the use of approved rental e-scooters as environmentally friendly modes of transport in some specific locations in the UK (find out more here: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/e-scooter-trials-guidance-for-users>).

**There are no e-scooter trials within Kent or Medway.**

**E-scooters – are you breaking the law?**

**Can I ride my e-scooter to school or work?** **No, it's illegal...**  
E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It's not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them.

**Can I ride my e-scooter on the pavement?** **No, it's illegal...**  
You cannot use e-scooters on public footpaths, cycle lanes or roads.

**What happens if I'm caught using my e-scooter in public spaces?** **The scooter may be seized and as a result, destroyed.**  
If stopped by an officer, you may be asked to complete a breath and drugs test. You also risk a £300 fine and six penalty points on your licence for no insurance.
