Headteacher News

Dear Families,

I am delighted to begin this briefing by sharing some truly wonderful news: our nursery build is now complete! We have appointed a nursery manager and a small, dedicated team who will begin the exciting work of setting the provision up. Equipment is arriving slowly but surely, and over the coming weeks the setting will begin to grow into a flourishing and vibrant space for our youngest children. We will be opening a waiting list very soon, and further details will be shared in term 4. Alongside this, our building team will soon be leaving site as the new staffroom is also nearing completion. Final furnishings and fixtures are still to be finished, but we are very close to handing this space over to staff, which will be a much-appreciated addition to the school.

Last week I had the wonderful opportunity to visit our reception class; Crystal. They invited me to share their ambitions for the future. It was gorgeous as they told me about wanting to be doctors, police officers, firefighters, farmers, singers, racing car drivers and many more.. The dedication to writing their sentences so neatly too was lovely.

Change very much feels like the theme for us at the moment. I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks for the many warm messages of congratulations following my new role. Your support and kindness means a great deal. This morning, I shared this news with the children in assembly. I explained it by likening my role to that of a gardener: previously caring for and nurturing one flower bed, and now looking after many growing plants and shaping a beautiful garden. I hope it made sense to them — and reassured them — as much as it felt right to say.

We are seeking a new headteacher to lead the school from September. I would also like to offer reassurance to families: my focus as Headteacher remains firmly at Loose Primary School. I am committed to our pupils, staff, and community, and to ensuring that the school continues to thrive and grow.

There is also some very exciting cultural news to share. Our exhibition in the museum will be starting soon, and this will be a hugely fantastic opportunity for the children to share their learning with the wider community by holding a space in Maidstone Museum. Mrs. Malhotra and Mrs. Planck are doing a wonderful job coordinating this project. I've even heard a rumor that we may have a spot on Radio 2 to help advertise the exhibition — how amazing is that? It truly shows that potential is limitless, and that what began as a small idea is growing into something very special indeed.

Finally, a huge congratulations to our Year 4 and Year 5 pupils who have taken part in the F1 competition. We have seen some excellent designs submitted, all of which will be displayed and celebrated. Fourteen winners will be joining us with an educational visit to the Williams F1 Centre. We cannot wait to share photos with you very soon.

As ever, thank you for your continued support as we move through this exciting period of growth together.

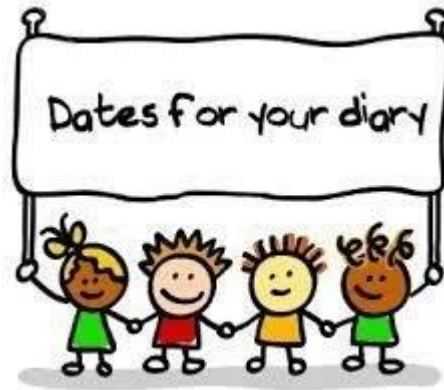

OSI COULD HELP YOU

OSI (Online Support and Intervention) is an online platform designed to help parents to learn tools and techniques to help their child (aged 5 to 12 years old) to overcome difficulties with anxiety.

Parents work through weekly online modules that contain videos, quizzes, and interactive worksheets. Parents are also supported by a weekly telephone/videocall appointment with a practitioner.

You can access OSI at a convenient time for you using any electronic device!
