WHAT HAVE WE LEARNT?

Thank you to everyone who attended Parents' Evening this week. It was lovely to see so many of you and we hope you found the meetings helpful. If you were unable to attend, please don't hesitate to get in touch and we will be happy to arrange a time to talk.

It has been a very busy week in class as the children completed their SATs mock tests. We are extremely proud of the effort and determination they showed throughout. They worked very hard and approached the assessments with a positive attitude. Once all of the papers have been marked, the scores will be sent home.

In Maths, we have continued our work on shape. The children have been learning about angles, including measuring them accurately and exploring the interior angles of different shapes. They have also been practising how to calculate unknown angles using what they already know.

In Literacy, we are continuing to link our writing to our Science topic on the heart and circulatory system. The children have now completed the planning stage for their explanation text and will soon begin turning their ideas into full pieces of writing. Features have included formal language, semi-colons and technical vocabulary, and shall continue to use features taught in previous units too.

Reading has continued to look at our book *The Garbage King*. We have had a particular focus on inference and explaining, but have also had some lessons on vocabulary and retrieval too. There have been many discussions over the actions of the characters in the book, and the morality or motivations of the characters with complex answers.

PSHE has started to look at the complex issue of identity, and what that really means. We have looked at ourselves carefully to determine what we mean by this, figure out what makes up our own identity, and then how others may view that differently.
