Update on Free School Meals

Following our recent communication regarding the Free School Meals (FSM) changes for the 2026/27 academic year, we would like to provide some further clarification:

New Applications

Any new applications submitted and found to be eligible will now be assigned to either the *Targeted* or *Expanded* category:

- **Eligible – Targeted (Those in receipt of UC with household earnings of less than £7,400 excluding benefits)** - The child should begin receiving Free School Meals immediately, as they are eligible under current criteria.
- **Eligible – Expanded (Those in receipt of UC with household earnings of more than £7,400 excluding benefits):** The child will begin receiving Free School Meals from ***September, at the start of the new academic year.***

Existing ‘Protected’ Applications - (these are the children that have been eligible previously before the changes)

Existing applications that are currently classed as ‘protected’ will begin to be reviewed in the coming weeks.

- Children will continue to receive Free School Meals until the end of the current term.
- These applications will display as **‘Eligible (until end of term)’** during this period.
- Following review, each application will be updated to one of the following statuses in readiness for September: *Targeted*, *Expanded*, or *Not eligible*.

- Please note that these reviews are being completed in phases, so updates will not occur for all applications at the same time.

Music Lessons at Loose

Would your child like to learn a musical instrument? There are so many benefits for children, some being:

- Increases memory skills
- Builds creativity
- Boosts confidence
- Promotes physical co-ordination
- Improves social skills
- Drums especially can be a powerful therapeutic tool for children with ADHD, helping to improve focus, reduce hyperactivity and enhance overall wellbeing.

Limited spaces available for **Guitar, Drums & Singing** lessons for September.

Drums and singing lessons are individual lessons, £12.36 per 20 minute lesson or £18.36 per 30 minute lesson, payable by monthly direct debit of £34 or £50.50 for 33 lessons per year.

Guitar lessons are £10.40 per 30 minute group lesson, £26 per month for 30 lessons per year.

(There is also a one off cost of £16 for teaching materials for drums and guitar or £11 for the piano / keyboard book.).

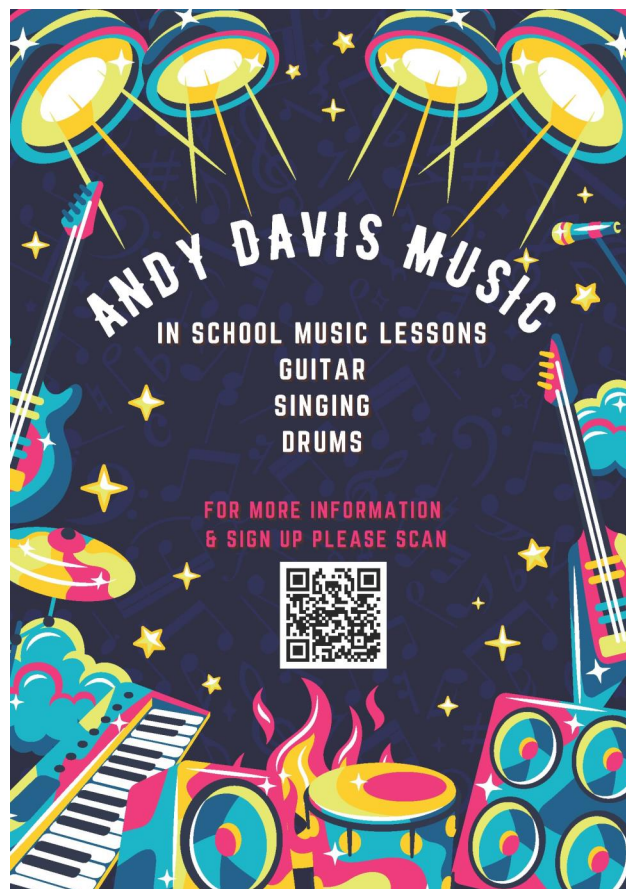
