### Headteacher News

#### Dear Community,

I hope this finds you well. We are striding into the second term already and the jingle jangle of Christmas is in the air. Nativities being put together, costumes being made and the excitement in the children is building. Our team is planning the Christmas service in the church and the tree is being ordered for the hall. It's a wonderful term ahead.

I often talk about our values and I truly believe they build on the good work you do with your children at home. It's important that we recognise when we see and engage with the values we teach and this term I have really felt the values echo throughout the school. I was filled with pride last week. Pride in the staff, pride in the children and pride in the school as a whole. It really was an absolute privilege to lead our remembrance service on Friday last week. The children walked with a silent gracefulness onto our KS2 playground and gathered together as a large school community of over 660 children and all of our

staff team. Our proud teachers lead them to stand respectfully around a wonderful wooden cross that our local church lent us. As the children read their poems and presented their class wreaths, there was a reverence in the air which resonated through each and every one of us. It was the first time I've seen the whole school together, and it really was awe-inspiring. You would have all been so extremely proud of the children's attitude to this important service.

Our values of respect and pride also echoed through the voices of our Year 6 pupils during our parent tours. We had a team of our confident year 6 pupils speaking about the school and what it means to them. They were trusted to write their own words and share them with the hall full of prospective parents. They delivered on this and I struggled to hold back a few tears of pride. They said such warm and honest things about the school. The responsibilities around the school that they had, how they enjoyed curriculum topics they studied and how it felt like a family.

The compliments from our visitors were well received and all of the visitors spoke so warmly about the behavior and attitudes of the children in the school, the wonderful site and the calm and focused feel of all of the lessons.

#### Learning

Our maths team spent some time in the classrooms across the school this week and it was a pleasure to see how well your children are engaging in the maths curriculum. The relationships with the teachers were really trusting and the children challenged often to think about mathematical concepts. The classrooms were full of practical resources to support the visual understanding of tricky concepts and the children spoke really positively about the new maths work books. Mr. Bedford-Cooper and Mrs. Weston were also joined by our governing body and all are really doing a wonderful job in ensuring our maths curriculum is challenging for all and ensuring potential is limitless.

#### Colder weather..

We are two weeks in to the second term of the year and we are really noticing the change in weather. The season of wet play is upon us and most of the children are coming in wearing their warmer coats. It's important that children get to play and run free to burn off energy. For this reason, our aim is for children to be outside so there may well be times, in lighter drizzle, that children are out playing. Please do make sure that a suitable coat is worn to school for this reason.




