REMINDER RE MEDICINE POLICY

Medicines

We are only able to administer 'prescribed only' medicine during school hours (not 'as and when' medicines) and this should be in its original container, with the prescriber's instructions and child's name attached where relevant. All medicines must be labelled and handed into the main school office (please do NOT give to teachers) along with a completed medication form.

Antibiotics

If your child is on an antibiotic where 3 daily doses are required, please time these so that they are all done outside of school hours. For antibiotics where 4 doses are required, please time the dose that needs to be done in school for **11.45am when the school medicine medicine round is done.**

Asthma pumps and other critical medicines are kept in classes and are administered as and when required by the classroom staff.

Thank you for your co-operation in this matter. As you will appreciate with over 660 children at Loose we need to adhere to these guidelines in order to keep children and medicines safe within the school environment.

Medical/Dental Appointments

Where possible all medical and dental appointments should be made **outside of school hours** or in the school holidays. We understand that hospital appointments may be during the school day. Copies of all appointment letters must be emailed into the school office for our files so the absence can be recorded as authorised.

Queen's Green Canopy Project

Back in 2022 the eco council applied for 21 trees under the 'Queen's Green Canopy' project as part of celebrations for the jubilee. The school has been gifted a standard tree for each class to plant in the school grounds by Plan Tree (KCC's Tree Establishment Strategy) to be a part of extending the UK's tree cover and reaching its 2050 carbon net-zero target.




Copper Tree Court - Bad Parking
