Assistant Headteacher News


Happy New Year and it was good to see all the children back on Wednesday for the start of term. Even though it is a shorter term, there is lots of exciting things to look forward to.



Since Covid 19 we have seen a dramatic rise in young people experiencing anxiety. The daily pressures on our children are increasing from targets and testing in the classroom to the rise of pressure advertising and social media. For many of our children the world, or certain aspects of it, is overwhelming, complex and scary.

From separation and social anxiety to performance and health anxiety, an increasing number of children now benefit from direct support to manage their worries.

This workshop will introduce you to the current thinking around children's anxiety and move onto exploring ways to support young people to manage their anxiety more. Strategy led and with a useful resource pack we aim to help you support your child moving forward.

Kent Locality Model for SEN Inclusion

We would like to draw your attention to a live full public consultation for parents, schools, stakeholders, charities and other services known as the 'Localities model for SEN Inclusion' which **closes on the 24th January 2024**. This is your opportunity to have your voices heard in a level playing field.

Kent are proposing to establish a Locality Model for Special Educational Needs (SEN) Inclusion in Kent, to help drive necessary countywide improvements to mainstream inclusion and education, for children and young people aged 5 to 16 years old with SEN. It seeks to raise the profile of SEN Inclusion and the benefits of children with SEN being educated with their peers.

The proposed Model, would mean:-

- \cdot SEN support and services being accessed and delivered in a new way
- · Children's needs being identified accurately and assessed in a timely and effective way.

 \cdot KCC, schools, the NHS and other SEN service providers working together locally to secure improvements

- · Helping all pupils to thrive at school
- · Helping parents to have confidence in a mainstream offer for their child.
