Right, I want you to think if you couldn't use your legs and if you didn't have a wheelchair one of the other options would be a push chair and that means you wouldn't have a lot of Independence. Whizz kidz not only provides children like us with chairs they also teach us how to use them and do cool tricks, so when you see someone in a chair just remember




### Shout Outs


