
'WORLD BOOK DAY'

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT (PD)

Next term, YR will be taking part in PE lessons for the first time! Our focus will be on 'ball skills' for this term. Each class will be having a focused PD day each week. Children will need to come to school wearing their PE kit on their class PD day. They will stay in their kit all day; therefore, you will not need to send a kit to keep in school. Please ensure that earrings are *not* worn in school on your child's PD day.

LEARNING IN TERM 5

Our theme for next term is 'Wild World' and our learning will be based around the core texts: 'Errol's Garden by Gillian Hibbs, 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle and 'Yucky Worms' by Vivian French. The children will be learning about living things in the natural environment.
