In maths, we have focused on multiplication and division, consolidating our knowledge of long multiplication and short division. Next week, we shall be looking at long division in detail.

We have continued to work on our sentence accuracy and relative clauses in literacy. The children have produced some beautiful writing about the mythical city of Tyrenegarde and have enjoyed creating their own version of the city. We have enjoyed reading the creativity in the children's writing, with cities ranging from Victorian steam technology to dark magic run by necromancers! In science, we have investigated the effects of distance, light and shadow. Our independent variable was the distance from the light source, with children measuring the size of the shadow produced. This was a really engaging way to learn about shadows and light, with the chance for the children to further hone their investigative skills.
