WHAT HAVE WE LEARNT?

Maths has been incredibly exciting this week. The children have been finding patterns when multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. It has been great to see the children apply this knowledge to problems such as money and measure.

The children have explored character and setting descriptions this week with a focus on carefully chosen but ambitious adjectives. They then applied these skills to start their own twisted fairy tale and describe the not so Big Bad Wolf.

In PSHE, the children have started a new unit – Economic Wellbeing. They are considering value for money and will go on to explore how to keep their money safe.

There has been great excitement about our new dance topic. We have explored the dynamics of dance and started to consider the use of the space.
